Dear DLSZ Parents and Guardians:

Upon the request of various sectors of the De La Salle Santiago Zobel School (DLSZ) community, we have uploaded to the DLSZ website (www.dlszobel.edu.ph) the presentation slides created by the DLSZ administration in relation to its presentation on March 7, 2015 (Saturday) to various stakeholders of the community, including Ayala Alabang Village Association, Inc. (AAVA), Barangay Ayala Alabang, DLSZ parents and guardians, and residents of the immediate vicinity of DLSZ. The presentation is available at [this link](#).

The presentation lays out a comprehensive program of action for addressing various issues affecting the immediate vicinity of the DLSZ campus, including traffic flow and management, reduction of vehicles, air quality, and enforcement of traffic and community rules. The presentation includes the creation of a multi-sectoral committee (the Committee) that will formulate, implement, and update a traffic management and community relations plan (the Plan) that will include the said program of actions and other input from stakeholders in the community.

The proposed Committee will consist of representatives from DLSZ, DLSZ (De La Salle Santiago Zobel School) Parents Association, Inc., AAVA and the neighborhood where DLSZ is located. The power to formulate, implement and update the Plan will be delegated to the Committee to ensure that the Plan will contemplate and represent the interest of the stakeholders.

The salient points of the presentation have been included in a proposed memorandum of understanding (MOU), a copy of which has been presented to AAVA. The MOU is intended as a starting point for drafting and finalizing a memorandum of agreement (MOA) that will be binding on concerned parties. We envision an MOA that will result from a constructive discussion of ideas among various stakeholders.

We acknowledge AAVA and our community leaders for setting the impetus that initiated the ongoing discussion regarding community issues. We fervently hope that AAVA and other stakeholders will seriously consider working with us, as it is our firm belief that collaboration among stakeholders is indispensable in our effort to address the issues that beset our community today.
